December 2007

Monday 3rd December

Shenley, this morning a single **Red Admiral** flying along the base of a sun drenched hedgerow at 11.00 - Jim Terry

November 2007

Wednesday 28th November

Spotted a Red Admiral in the garden today in **Hayes,** on a very cold dark morning, It flew in a Jasmine climber, to roost perhaps!! - Penny

Thursday 22nd November

And my personal record continues to stretch. I revisited Grove Farm but failed to find that Speckled Wood again. However on the way back a **Red Admiral** (in good condition) briefly settled on ivy right in front of me near the busy Greenford Road / Whitton Avenue West lights (NW side on WAW) in **Greenford / TQ18.** But too many pedestrians and traffic so it soon flew off again. Conditions similar to yesterday but a degree or so colder. - Mike Rubin

Wednesday 21st November

A new record for me. A **Speckled Wood** surprised me at lunchtime in **Grove Farm, Middlesex (TQ18)** on the hill below the council estate. Not bad considering the recent cold snap. I t was on the wing and got a good look, but quickly lost it in the glare and shadows. My previous latest record was Red Admiral 5th November a few years ago, and for Speckled Wood 30th October this year at the same spot in Grove Farm as today's. Conditions sunny 11C / 7C Dewpoint fairly light wind in that sheltered location. - Mike Rubin

Friday 16th November

Just had a walk over **Trent Park** with Robin J. White (Fri 16th November 2007) and we both saw a Peacock near the Dew Pond, settled on Bramble at 13.26 GMT - my latest record ever for the Enfield area - Robert Callf (Not bad eh, two late butterflies in the same week!).

Monday 12th November

Visited **Broomfield Park, Palmers Green, N13** this afternoon (12th November) and saw a Red Admiral flying around the dilapidated Broomfield House at 12.55 GMT, also adult-winter Mediterranean Gull and male Shoveler in the Park - Robert Callf

A friend a who records for me reported a small tortoiseshell in her garden in **Mill End** last **Sunday Nov 4th**. It was looking a bit tatty! - Ann Piper

Sunday 4th November

Late season butterfly sighting - in calm warm/sunny conditions at 11am, a Comma flying nearby to the **M1/A405 road junction at Bricket Wood**. - David Chandler

Saturday 3rd November

A few butterflies around **Horsenden Hill** during a LNHS bird walk today, 3rd November: 1 Red Admiral, 2 Speckled Woods and 2 Holly Blues. The first Holly blue was nectaring on ivy flowers on the south side of Horsenden Hill during the morning. The second was discovered after dark while Dave Howdon and I were moth-ing in Perivale Wood, roosting on an ivy flower - Andy Culshaw

Red Admiral in **St Albans** this morning. Small Tortoiseshell at the Millais exhibition at Tate Britain, **Millbank SW1**, Middx - The Blind Girl - Malcolm Hull

Tring, Saturday, someone likes me more than I thought as the weather here this am was glorious. I spent most of it inside wating for a man to come and fix my set top box but once he had gone I went to play. There were two red ad on the last few buddliea flowers in the garden and two more in the field behind my house, where the shelter of a fence makes for some very warm nettles. These two were both intermittently feeding on ivy and coming down to test the nettle leaves. One laid at least two eggs (image of one attached). Then the sun disappeared so no other species added. Had hoped to find a speckled wood - Nick Bowles

Friday, saw a Red Admiral on the ivy near the playground in the centre of **Gunnersbury Park** just before noon. Hmm some of the ivy there is still flowering. Was hoping to spot some Speckled Woods but a lump of cloud hid the sun for much of my walk. Ho hum. I've only ever seen one November butterfly before - a glimpse of a RA a few years ago one mild Nov 5th at Stockley Park - Mike Rubin

Thursday 1st November

Following on from my recent record of a late holly blue at Railway Fields, today (1/11/07) I saw 2 "spiralling" speckled wood on the Parkland Walk (former railway line between Finsbury Park and Alexandra Palace) - David Bevan

Several dozen harlequin ladybirds have invaded the house and are marching purposefully about looking for food (presumably). All appear to be succinea which I have reported to this site: http://www.harlequin-survey.org/recording.htm - Robin Pearson

October 2007

Tuesday 30th October

Rebecca Turpin (BTCV officer based at Railway Fields) reported seeing a holly blue at **Railway Fields** today (30/10/07). This is certainly the latest date for the butterfly at RF, but like everybody else we had a poor year at RF - our one highlight being the arrival of a single marbled white on July 13th - a new butterfly for the site - David Bevan

Monday 29th October

A Peacock flying and sunning at Garston (Watford) at noon - Colin Everett

Friday 26th October

My first Peacock for over a month at Grove Rd, St Albans on Tuesday 23rd - Malcolm Hull

Wednesday 24th October

Late news from the **18th October,** 1 Green-veined white seen at the Dew Pond, **Trent Park** by Robin White - news via Robert Callf

Monday 22nd October

Nice to get a late speckled wood at $\mathbf{Ickleford}$ at Gerry's Hole /pond on Sunday 21st October, the only butterfly I saw - Stuart Pittman

With it being outside the transect season, thought I'd forward the two Speckled Woods seen in **Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park** on Saturday 20th. On Sunday 21st, there was a big (estimated as Small Tortoiseshell <> Red Admiral size), chestnut-brown? moth flying round the lights on Whitechapel tube station about half an hour after dusk. Apologies, I didn't see it settle so can't be any clearer on the description. If it rings any bells at all with anyone for any possible ID then I'd be suitably grateful - Keir Mottram

Sunday 21st October

Up to 5 Red Admirals nectaring in my **Harpenden** garden on ivy flowers throughout the day in temperatures between 7 and 10 degrees C. Also a large bumble bee - Robin Pearson

Saturday 20th October

Tring, I have been at home for last two and bit weeks and seen the number of butterflies in my garden gradually fall away. No more whites and both Peacock and Tortie now only a memory but today three Red Admirals simultaneously and a Comma as well all on/around my buddleia (good number of flowers as a result of a hard 'trim' in July) and to my joy the first Speckled wood for two years a little later in the day. Don't suppose I have ever recorded a first for the year garden species in the last half of October before - Nick Bowles

Thursday 18th October

Waterford area, 1 Common Blue - Andrew Middleton

Wednesday 17th October

News for today - 1 Red Admiral, at Parkside Farm at 13.30 hrs. - Robert Callf.

Monday 15th October

By entrance to **Thunderfield Grove**, 1 Comma and something (butterfly or moth) flew through the carpark at Bencroft West. Otherwise despite some really good sunshine - NOTHING. Just some hornets around the remaining ivy flowers and beware of falling acorns, they could hurt!! Liz Goodyear and Andrew Middleton

News for yesterday (Sun 14th October 2007) - 1 Red Admiral, at Park Farm and 1 Speckled Wood, on the edge of Rough Lot, Trent Park - Robert Callf & Phil Rhodes

Thursday 11th October 7 butterfly species today!

Little around but went to **Waterford Heath** at 4pm and saw a solitary small copper on south side and a meadow brown on the north - Steve Kiln

A **Holly blue** was present in **St James's Park** today-the first I've seen for a couple or more weeks - Stuart Paston

Red Admiral, **Ponders End** garden today - Andrew Middleton

This afternoon, 11th October, in absolutely perfect weather, I saw a single Small White over the restoration area of **Aldbury Nowers** northern compartment. Michael Pearson

News for today - 1 Comma, nectaring on thistle head at $\bf Parkside\ Farm$, also 1 Speckled Wood here along Salmons Brook and 1 Silver Y - Robert Callf

Wednesday 10th October

Paul Thursh at **Aldbury** today photographed a Meadow Brown which must be around a month later than in most years although this year has had some late records - news via Andrew Palmer

Spoke to Robin White today (Weds 10th October 2007) and he said that the Clouded Yellow he saw was last Thurs 4th October 2007 at $\bf South\ Lodge\ Farm$ - Robert Callf

Monday 8th October

News from Sunday 7th, 1 female Common Blue seen at **Parkside Farm** and a Speckled Wood at Park Farm on the same day - Robert Callf

Friday 5th October

More news for today - 3 Speckled Wood, (2 near Merryhill's Brook, 1 along Leeging Beech Gutter at 'Three-bridges', Trent Park); 1 Comma, along bridle-path near Shaws Wood, Trent Park. Earlier, visited **Trent Park** for an hour (12.00 - 13.00 BST) today and recorded the following: 2 Comma, (1 on Michaelmas daisies, set-aside field near Triangular Wood, 1 Sect. 8 of my transect,

'New Fields'); 1 Small Copper, 'New Fields' near Sport's Field; 1 Large White, near Oakwood entrance. Also a Grass Snake basking on the edge of the cemetery - Robert Callf

Thursday 4th October

News for yesterday (Weds 3rd October 2007) and today (Thurs 4th October 2007) - 1 Speckled Wood near Duncan's Wood, **Enfield Chase** yesterday and 1 Speckled Wood at **Parkside Farm** today near Hadley Road Pumping Station - Robert Callf

Monday 1st October

News for Sun 30th September 2007 - 1 Speckled Wood, near The Obelisk, **Trent Park**. Nothing to report today - Robert Callf

On **Saturday**, one male Brimstone and one Red Admiral (flying SW at quite a height) at **Amwell NR** - Jan Hein van Steenis

September 2007

Saturday 29th September

Fir and Pond Woods NR... on the meadow... 2 small coppers - David Gompertz

News for today - A few whites seen today, only one positively identified as a Small White on Michaelmas daisies at South Lodge Farm - Robert Callf

Friday 28th September

News for today - 1 Red Admiral, sheltering along hedgerow, **Hog Hill, Vicarage Farm** this morning before the rain started. Also a Common Redstart in the same area - Robert Callf

Thursday 27th September

News for today - 1 Green-veined White, on thistle-head along **Merryhill's Brook at Vicarage** Farm - Robert Callf

Wednesday 26th September

Painted Lady in garden lunchtime, nectaring on Verbena Bonariensis. **N.W Bishop's Stortford** - Jim Fish

Only one butterfly seen today (Weds 26th September 2007) - 1 Speckled Wood, along **Jubilee Path at Park Farm** (rather worn, settled in a sheltered sunny spot) - Robert Callf

Tuesday 25th September

On Saturday 22nd September I saw 2 Clouded Yellow on **Poors Field Ruislip.** Also, Small Heath, Small Copper, Brimstone, 5 Speckled Wood, 2 Comma, Small White and Red Admiral - Steve Pash

News for today (Tues 25th September 2007) - 2 Red Admiral, (1 flew S at Parkside Farm, 1 flew S at Vicarage Farm) - Robert Callf

Monday 24th September

Kings Langley, Violet Chandler's garden - few butterflies seen on Saturday (22nd) on the garden transect buddlia only Small Whites; but there were a couple of good sightings of butterflies passing through - a Small Tortoiseshell and a Speckled Wood - David Chandler

News for yesterday (Sun 23rd September 2007) - 4 Speckled Wood, (3 at Trent Park - 2 together, at Shaws Wood, 1 near Merryhill's Brook; 1 at Vicarage Farm). News for today (Mon 24th September 2007) - 1 Speckled Wood, at Park Farm; 1 Small Heath, along Leeging Beech Gutter at Vicarage Farm - getting quite late. Also saw possibly 2 Red Admiral but did not get clinching views - Robert Callf.

Walking across **Datchworth Green** yesterday I was somewhat surprised to see a Painted Lady settled on the grass - Alan Reynolds

Commas, Brimstones Speckled Woods and Red Admiral all out at **Bricket Wood Common** on Saturday. A fresh emergence of Large Whites, Small Whites and Green-veined Whites in **St**

Albans - Malcolm Hull

Went to **Waterford Heath** afternoon **22nd**, saw 3 whites, 2 small heath, one comma, one small heath, one small copper, one meadow brown and a clouded yellow - Steve Kiln

News for Sat 22nd September 2007 - 3 Small Heath, (1 at 'Old Golf Course', Trent Park, 2 at Vicarage Farm - 1 along Merryhill's Brook and 1 near Allotments); 5 Speckled Wood, at Trent Park (1 at Dew Pond, 1 at Shaws Wood, 3 near Merryhill's Brook along bridle-path). Several unidentified White spp., plus a large Nymphalid at distance - Robert Callf

Friday 21st September

News for today - 1 Red Admiral, near Dew Pond, Trent Park; 5 Speckled Wood, (4 at Trent Park - 1 Shaws Wood, 3 near Merryhill's Brook; 1 at Allotments, Vicarage Farm) - Robert Callf

Thursday 20th September

News for today - 1 Red Admiral, edge of Water Grdn., Trent Park; 6 Speckled Wood, at Trent Park (1 edge of Wter Grdn., 1 Shaws Wood, 4 along bridle-path near Merryhill's Brook) - Robert Callf

Wednesday 19th September

Almost trod on a Clouded Yellow in **Ware Park Quarry** this lunchtime. Luckily it eventually settled on some Goat's Rue and I was able to photograph it. The only butterfly I saw there in cool, windy conditions - Andrew Wood

Harpenden at 3pm, just one Red Admiral braving the blustery conditions nectaring on my ivy this afternoon, see pic. - Robin Pearson

Only one butterfly seen today (Weds 19th September 2007) - 1 Speckled Wood, at Shaws Wood, Trent Park - Robert Callf

Tuesday 18th September

Whilst looking for stone & whinchat in set aside field by **Batford** saw 1 common Blue & 1 small copper - Darin Stanley

More news for yesterday (Mon 17th September 2007) - 1 Red Admiral, at Chase Rd., N14, flying around a Yew tree. News for today (Tues 18th September 2007) - 2 Red Admiral, (1 at Vicarage Farm, 1 in set-aside field N of Williams Wood, Trent Park); 3 Speckled Wood, together, in Shaws Wood, Trent Park - Robert Callf

On Wednesday and Thursday (12th and 13th Sep) the Red Admiral was still present in the garden in Kenton, alternating between basking and feeding on the ivy. Not seen it since though. Friday (14th) afternoon up Barnhill and Fryent Country Park I saw 12 Speckled Woods and 4 Whites during a long walk. On Monday (17th) I found 1 Small Copper by a south facing hedgerow in the large field West of Batts Field by Horsenden Hill. This despite 8/8ths cirrostratus and scattered cumulus cloud with the sun barely getting through. In Batts Field itself I saw 1 Speckled Wood (plus possible 2nd one but not sure). Today (18th) at Grove Farm I saw 3 Speckled Woods and 1 unidentified White despite cold temperatures (14C max?). Nothing but flies on the extensive ivy. So just hanging on here in North West London. Speckled Wood definitely the most noted. - Mike Rubin

Monday 17th September

I went over to **Chorleywood Common** on **Saturday 15th** for a walk & to try and see a Common Blue or Small Copper - butterflies I'd seen last year in the hay meadow just to the south of the Black Horse pub. I was sad to see the meadow had been mowed like a lawn and no vetches or sorrels could be seen. At the lower end of the slope near the Metropolitan railway a dozen or so Meadow Browns were still hanging on and two Red Admirals were nectaring om Ivy flowers... But that was just about it! David Chandler

Sunday 16th September

Cheshunt Park ~ Cheshunt Park Golf Course greenkeeper Keith enabled us to run a moth trap Sat/Sun night, and Mark Cooper identified the moths for the group. Not many species, but the list included centre-barred sallow, marbled beauty, willow beauty, large yellow underwings, square-spot and small square spot rustic, rustic, setaceous hebrew character and campion. Of the target grassland species, we encountered c6 small coppers, including one lacking the orange band trailing the upper hindwing, 2 small heath, and two female common blues. In addition, several speckled wood, a red admiral, a comma, and a flyby small tortoiseshell were seen. Towards the end of the walk, Adam Wilson alerted us to a clouded yellow flying over the last meadow, which created more excitement. Thanks to Derek Turner (CMS) and the group of 20 or so peaple that made for an enjoyable few hours - Andrew Middleton

At Folly Lane, **St Albans** this morning I had Small Tortoiseshell, a rare sight nowadays and Small Copper. This is only the third time I've seen Small Copper at this site in hundreds of visits over the last ten years. This afternoon I visited the two best Small Copper sites locally to see how it was doing there. Conditions were sunny but rather windy, so not ideal and numbers were down on last year. At **Nomansland Common, Wheathampstead** I saw 9 Small Copper and 1 Small Heath. At **The Warren, Colney Heath** I saw 9 Small Heath and 2 Small Copper. At **Gustardwood Common**, a new site for me, I saw no butterflies at all, though there is a reasonable amount of rabbit grazed grass/heather. Other species still out locally include Small & Large Whites, Red Admiral and Speckled Wood - Malcolm Hull

Had permission yesterday 15/9 to explore an amazing massive garden/with carp ponds, flower meadows etc near Balls Park, Hertford the highlight being a humming bird hawk moth photographed on my mobile phone - Stuart Pittman

Saturday 15th September

Waterford Heath, late morning 15th 3 of the following comma, small heath, green-veined white and meadow brown. 2 small copper, one common blue. On **13th** brimstone and painted lady in my garden in **Bengeo** - Steve Kiln

More news for yesterday (Fri 14th September 2007) - 2 Speckled Wood, along Merryhill's Brook at Vicarage Farm; 1 Small Copper, along Leeging Beech Gutter at Vicarage Farm. Thursday 13th September

Waterford Heath south pit, 2 Small Copper, 3 Common Blue, 2 Small Heath, 2+ Meadow Brown and several whites in a hurry. Earlier at **Broxbourne Wood NR**, very little to report apart from a handful of Speckled Woods, ud whites and one pristine comma - Liz Goodyear, Andrew Middleton, Sharon Hearle with Graham Goodall (HBRC) and Fiona Annal (CMS)

Just a few sightings today (Tues 11th September 2007) - 2 Speckled Wood, (1 Triangular Wood, Trent Park, 1 along Leeging Beech Gutter at Vicarage Farm); 1 Red Admiral, in set-aside field N of Williams Wood, Trent Park). More news for yesterday (Mon 10th September 2007) - 2 Small Copper, at 'New Fields', Trent Park (same individuals as on 9th); 3 Speckled Wood, (1 along tube-line near Cockfoster's entrance, 1 near Oakwood entrance, 1 near Triangular Wood - making a total of 7 in the park for the day); 1 Green-veined White, near Triangular Wood, Trent Park; 1 Painted Lady, nectaring on michaelmas daisies, set-aside field near Triangular Wood, Trent Park; 1 female Meadow Brown, 'New Fields', Trent Park - Robert Callf

Horsenden Hill, yesterday I saw 2 Speckled Woods, 1 Meadow Brown and an unidentified white. Today even worse, with 1 Meadow Brown and 2 Whites (one stopped on a Buddlheia - +ve id for Green Veined White). Also since yesterday lunchtime Batts Field has been mowed. :(Lots of nectar sources annhiliated as there were still flowering thistles and others yesterday. I think for me the butterfly season is more or less over. Just a moment ago I saw a Red Admiral fluttering around the Ivy in the garden in Kenton. Didn't see it settle though and it soon vanished. As I write this about half a zillion starlings just flew into the garden from the south. Invasion! If only they were butterflies and not common birds. ;) - Mike Rubin

News from 9th September, hugely surprised to see a **Silver-washed Fritillary** in **Abney Park** early this afternoon, whilst taking a walk with several of our members (about 12.15, Sunday 9/9). It settled on the chapel (which you know very well now, of course), for about 30 seconds before flying towards the roof, where we lost sight of it. First site record since 2001, we believe. Also 12+ Speckled Wood, incl. pair mating - Garry [James] & 'Terns'

Monday 10th September

This year, 2007, I have recorded only a total of 11 CBs on transect visits during these five weeks. Not much else about – a single Holly Blue, some Gatekeepers, Meadow Browns, Speckled Woods and a few Whites - Ian Small

Saturday 11th August

Just a few items of interest - 1 Small Heath, at Vicarage Farm on Tues 7th August and Thurs 9th August. Friday 10th August

Went out with Andy Culshaw on 9th around 1130 and found three brown argus including a mating pair. We managed a couple of good shots of the singleton - Martin Smithand after a couple of failures, I finally caught up with the Brown Argus reported by Mike Rubin on Horsenden Hill. Meadow Brown - Plenty of tatty ones. Especially the males. Gatekeeper - Mostly females now and decreasing in number. Small Copper - 3 or 4, Speckled Wood - 2 or 3, Green Veined White - 1 positive ID. Another unid'd, white seen on the wing. Common Blue - 1 Male seen in Batts field. Holly Blue - 1, Painted Lady - 1 very fresh but fairly small individual in the northern most meadow West of the road - Mike Rubin

Sunday 5th August

Saw a male **Orange Tip** at **Watford Football Club** this afternoon **(4th August)** in the warm sunshine. - Clive Burrows

Had an excellent afternoon walk in and around **Ladywalk Wood**, **Maple Cross** on **Wednesday (1st August)**. This is the area where I saw over a dozen white letter hairstreaks last year. I was lucky this time too! Just one butterfly but it was low down basking on bramble so I had a good look! Also saw large white, green-veined white, a small copper, one holly blue and one common blue, a single peacock, several speckled woods and lots of gatekeepers and meadow browns. Then this evening looking out at the oak near my house I spotted two purple hairstreaks spiralling and landing high in the trees. <u>July 2007</u> On **Sun 29th July 2007**, recorded the following - 1 Red Admiral, at Dalrymple Close, N14; 1 Green-veined White, at Oakwood Park; 1 Speckled Wood, at Oakwood Park, nectaring on blackberry; 1 Essex Skipper and 2 Small Skipper at Oakwood Park. At Grovelands Park, Southgate I recorded the following - 5 Small Skipper; 2 Essex Skipper, mating; 1 Purple Hairstreak; 1 Greenveined White; 3 Peacock, together, on buddleia, near Priory - Robert Callf.

I went to **Symondshyde Wood** on **Friday 27th July** to look for the SWF but found a White Admiral instead - Trevor Chapman

Sunday 29th July

Rousebarn Lane, which runs along one edge of Whippendell Woods in Watford: Sat 27 July: There is a small car-park half way along and this has a solitary buddleia, which must be the only one around for hundreds of yards and, given where it is in the woods, is well worth checking out if you are going observing butterflies. Last year it had a Silver-Washed Fritillary on it. This time it, at about 11.30, it was supporting 9 peacocks, several meadow browns and 2 white admirals. Two hours later the white admirals had gone, but there were now about 19 peacocks, several meadow browns and a red admiral and 2 commas. A Gatekeeper there did not appear to be nectaring but had set up its territory amongst the leaves, which would be a bit like trying to set up home in Waterloo station. Also a hornet worker appeared to be trying to hunt the butterflies, but I only saw it tackling peacocks, which just jumped away and flew off. I wonder if the meadow browns would have been so successful. Green-veined white, 1 speckled wood, gatekeepers, another red admiral and quite a few holly blues were seen along Rousebarn Lane. This classic country lane has elm trees and suckers along much of its length, but I failed to see any sign of white-letter hairstreaks as I walked along. I stayed in one place, at the corner of the Lane and the golf-club drive, catching tantilizing glimpses of possible WLHs for three quarters of an hour, the sun going in and out and quite a breeze all decreasing my chances, or so I thought. The matter was confused by what might have been WLHs flying up and challenging passing holly blues, but none of the sightings was conclusive. At that point, just as I was about to give up, I got a definite i.d. of a WLH, perched on a leaf about 20 feet away (viewed clearly through binoculars), in exactly the same location that I saw my very first, about 45 years ago - Andrew King

Barnhill, weather much better than forecast so fancied some fresh air. Yesterday's biblical downpour doesn't seem to have affected the butterflies. Huge numbers of meadow browns, gatekeepers and small (essex) skippers. Good numbers of Speckled Woods too, plus a few Peacocks and Holly Blues. One Red Admiral. Also saw a few Common Darter dragonflies and Common Blue Damsels. As Barnhill has a lot of oak trees I thought I'd look out for Purple Hairstreak as I haven't seen that one here before. The whole walk went in vain there until the last moment, when near the Jubilee Line I thought I saw soem flying high up on an Ash Tree. Then as I headed home I got very close to one with the camera on a young oak near the bridge over the Jubilee Line. Result! First time I've seen any Hairstreak within a mile of home. Also the Ragwort bush had scores of Cinnabar caterpillars on it. I've never seen so many in one place before! Also one huge hairy caterpillar than landed on my neck from who knows where. Unfortunately I flicked it off thinking it was another horsefly (still a few around). First I realised was red goo all over my fingers and an oblong hairy 'twig' falling away to the ground. If I'm up for it I'm tempted to go back up Barnhill later as the first Blackberries are ripe. And with all that rain they are big and juicy! Looking like a good year for them - Mike Rubin

Hexton Chalkpit was alive with **CHALKHILL BLUE's** at 6.45PM this PM. About 80+ around site. Also 1 Marbled White. Numerous gatekeeper & 2 Large Skipper - Darin Stanley

On a wonderful warm evening **2 Dark Green Fritillary** in the southern section of **Aldbury Nowers** (1 at 17.20 egg-laying behaviour but no eggs found: another rather tatty individual at 18.40 nectaring on thistles). On Saturday 14th July I saw 4 Purple Emperor in Park Wood, Ruislip. I arrived in the wood at 11.30, it was warm with more cloud than sunshine but as the day went on the sunshine became more prolonged. I searched the Pylon ride and Grub Ground without any luck so headed towards the high point of the wood near St Vincents Nursing home. At 15.05 I saw 2 males clashing and regularly settling in the canopy mainly on Hornbeam. They were joined by a 3rd individual which I couldn't confirm the sex of although it only appeared once and didn't get involved in any dogfights. This is the same sight I saw 2 males clashing a 2-3 years ago very close to the Nursing home and the entarnce to the wood from Fore Street. These 2 males were on display whenever the sun shone and I watched them for an 11/4 hrs. I walked back down the path, past house 33 where you had a sighting last year towards the point where the path takes a sharp left turn. Here I saw another male, intially at head height but then it disappeared into the canopy not to be seen again. At 17.40 I returned to the St Vincents end of the wood and 2 males were still clashing in the same place as earlier. Unfortunately I was going out in the evening so couldn't hang around. Other species seen on Saturday in Park Wood: 2 White Admiral, 3 Red Admiral, 5 Peacock, 1 Small T/S, 3 Comma, 4 L. White, 2 S. White, 1 L.Skipper, 4 Speckled Wood, 2 Holly Blue, 2 Ringlet, I Marbled White and numerous S/E Skipper, Gatekeeper and Meadow Brown I revisted the site on Sunday morning 10 - 11.30 but saw no PE. It was warm but overcast - Steve Pash

Horsenden Hill, spotted my first summer Peacock today. Very fresh. Lots of the usual Meadow Browns, Skippers, Gatekeepers (caught 2 mating - looked like the female does all the flying while the male dangles below if I observed correctly) and assorted whites. For me the butterfly of the day was Purple Hairstreak. Saw plenty of them up in the oaks. And found one area where it was relatively easy to observe them low down, and I even got a shot of one basking. I'll have to go back and try for more shots. The only closed wing shot that might have been good it went and hid behind a leaf. You can see its tail sticking out from behind...

We went into the bedroom and looked on the butterfly chart and she pointed out Purple Emperor! I asked mum "are you sure because I would not expect to see a PE in "our road"; but she said "yes I know what I saw and I got a very good look at it on the lavender by the back door before it shot off – and it didn't even go up the garden on to the buddlea". Mum is convinced she saw a PE; she even commented that she knew she had never seen a butterfly quite like this one before so knew it was different. I'm amazed, the nearest Purple Emperor colony is a good few miles away, but I always suspected they are around in the Watford area having found a PE caterpillar (with horns) as a child in the 60s. news via Dave Chandler (this sighting is only a short distance from a report we received late in 2006 of a male in a garden at Hunton Bridge. There is one common factor, that the willow rich Grand Union Canal is near to both sightings but we could not at present say where they are dispersing to although Whippendell Wood is fairly close and may have an assembly area despite little adjacent habitat)

Wormley Woods, Derry's Wood area, Laurence Drummond spent from 10am to 2.30pm in Wormley Woods and saw a male **Purple Emperor** cross a gap a little distance from the assembly area at 12.51; also 8 white admirals news via Andrew Middleton br />

Holly Blue and lot of Meadow Brown under the woodland canopy - Liz Goodyear & Andrew Middleton

On 13th July 07 I saw a male over **Claypits Wood** at 2.20pm, and Tony Clancy saw a female over the ride in **Broxbourne Wood NR** at around 2.50pm. We didn't see any in Northaw, but Mr Drummond called to report a female seen in **Wormley** (Derrys Wood area) around 1.30pm. - Andrew Middleton

Friday 13th July

I was up at **Aldbury Nowers** this morning and saw the **Dark Green Fritillary** again and managed to get some pics - Paul Thrush (news via Andrew Palmer)

Thursday 12th July

With HBRC staff, Liz and I visited **Broxbourne Wood NR** in the morning and eventually saw a **female purple emperor** sap run-feeding on the 'feeding tree' oak near the car-park 50 m down the main ride, at around 12.40. The female then perched on some ride sallows before flying off down the sallow break. We also saw 2 or 3 white admirals here. At Northaw the weather was not amenable to any sightings. We then went to the **south side of Wormley Wood** and saw two males clash-off from a hornbeam by the entrance clearing (somewhere we had looked at in previous years without any luck), then occasional sightings of at least one male at the territory found & described last year (near the sallow thickets but inside the taller stands of trees). On exiting the wood, a tatty male circled the clearing area a few times before settling on an ash tree. So probably a minimum of **four Pemps** seen in Wormley and a total of five for the day. At Wormley we also saw at least one white admiral – Andrew Middleton

Symondshyde woods nr Sandridge at 1745: **1m SILVER WASHED FRITILLARY** chasing commas & everything else in sight, 1 white Admiral, several commas, numerous Ringlet - Darin Stanley

Great Ashby Park, I saw 30 + Meadow Browns, 2 Marbled White, 1 White Letter Hairstreak, 10 + Ringlet and 1 Red Admiral this after at 5pm - Ian Hardy

Wednesday 11th July

I went to **Mudchute LNR today** [July 11th] during my lunch-hour to take my second BC field trip of the year at the site. One Surrey & SW London member joined me on my walk. The weather was dull but warm, the sun came fleetingly and the butterflies began to appear. We walked around the perimeter of the site and saw two Essex Skippers, we also found twelve Speckled Woods, thirty Meadow Browns, eight Gatekeepers, six Green-Veined Whites, seven Small Whites, a Peacock and a Red Admiral . We thought seeing a total of eight species on the day, considering the adverse conditions, was very good - David Chandler

Tuesday 10th July

Fir & Pond Wood, saw one **purple emperor** briefly at the territory at the top edge of the wood around 1.30pm, but no clashing, and weather a bit dull - Andrew Middleton

News for today - 4 Speckled Wood, (3 near Equestrian Centre, 1 at Park Farm - very fresh, newly

emerged); 6 Ringlet, (4 set-aside field near Shaws Wood; 2 at Park Farm); 2 Red Admiral, (1 along Leeging Beech Gutter near Water Grdn.; 1 at Vicarage Farm); 2 Green-veined White, (1 at Vicarage Farm; 1 at Park Farm); 1 Comma, at Vicarage Farm along Leeging Beech Gutter near Stables; 1 Small Tortoiseshell, at Vicarage Farm along Leeging Beech Gutter near Stables - Robert Callf

Monday 9th July

I have attached pictures of the male Purple Emperor, Purple Hairstreak and White Admiral I was lucky enough to photograph. On another note, I managed to see 5 or 6 White Letter Hairstreaks flying around one of the elms at **Spellbrook** (TL4816) at 4.35pm today. The elm in particular was one of the more prominent elms in the hedgerow opposite the American style carwash, and directly opposite a garden with two very large fir trees in it (and usually a couple of fluorescent red DynoRod vans!). I spent about 45minutes in the field behind the hedgerow, which was facing the sun, but quite windblown, without seeing anything. Only as I was leaving and walking along the opposite side of the very busy road did I spot a couple of WLH soaring up from the top of the elm. I stopped of course, and counted 5 or 6 flying in their distinctive erratic way around the top of this particular elm on the shady, but sheltered side. I am spurred on to check out the elms at Thorley Church now if I can find the time when the conditions are reasonably favourable - Bob Clift

This morning I visited **Harmergreen Wood** where I found 6 Marbled Whites last month. Today I also walked round an adjacent large grassy field, and counted a total of 70 Marbled Whites! There were also 10+ Small Skippers, 3 Small Coppers, 6 Gatekeepers and 4 Small Heaths, 2 Red Admirals, large numbers of Meadow Browns and Ringlets and several Large and Green-veined Whites. On my way back home I found 5 more Marbled Whites in **Burnham Green,** in the grassy margins of a pea field - David Booth

Sunday 8th July

Bishop's Stortford: On a walk on Sunday morning along the upper river Stort and old allotment site at the Red White and Blue Bishops Stortford. Numerous Meadow Browns, Ringlets, Gatekeepers, 2 Commas, 5 Red Admirals, 20+ Small Tortoiseshells, Small Skippers, Small Whites, and the highlight for me was my first sighting of a Marbled White on the old allotment site - Jim Fish

Tristan Bantock came out to monitor **Purple emperors** and we saw a 'pair' following and 2 clash around 1pm before it went quiet, **Potters Bar area.** Then two at **Northaw** including a very tatty individual, and one Pemp at **Wormley** (plus 4 white admirals there) The rides have been cut at Wormley......Incredible the devastation to nectar, and breeding habitat for ringlets, large skippers etc, plus all the other plants and associated invertebrates destroyed at the height of the summer. Further into the wood, the mowing machine missed an active will/chiff-chaff nest by 1m, low down in vegetation. Young are in the nest still, being fed. - Andrew Middleton and Tristan Bantock (we will be taking this issue up with the Woodland Trust and Natural England!)

The branch field trip to **Bricket Wood** turned up 19 species - Small & Large Skipper, Small Large & Green-veined White, Brimstone (half a dozen, all males & nectaring on bramble), Peacock, White Admiral (five seen), Red Admiral (at least 8), **Silver-washed Fritillary** (single female, located towards the north end of the main ride), Comma (more numerous than SWF & easily confused in flight), Painted Lady, Purple Hairstreak (several perched on bushes low down), Speckled Wood, Ringlet, Meadow Brown & Gatekeeper. We also saw Silver Y & yellow tail moths - Malcolm Hull (also lots of Marbled Whites!)

Led a field meeting (joint between the London Natural History Society and the British Entomological & Natural History Society) in **Cassiobury Park and Whippendell Wood**, where a possible **seven Silver-washed Fritillaries** (separate groups of two, at least three and two between the 'strawberry fields' and the north ride/central bridleway intersection); no definite

females were seen but these are always more elusive than the males. One White Admiral was seen as were a few Ringlets, but numbers of butterflies and indeed other insects were rather meagre. The few moths identified included a late *Tortrix viridana* - Colin Everett

Hooray Henry, after my 6th vistit to **Symondshyde woods** I got lucky. Between 1130 & 133 in Symondshyde woods located **1f Silver Washed fritillary**, 1 White letter Hairstreak (eventually getting them both in the open area by the bridlepath entrance to the wood), & 4 white Admirals. plenty of Meadow Browns, Ringlets, large whites & Green veined whites to be seen plus a large skipper - Darin Stanley

Saturday 7th July

Spent an hour or so watching the **Parkland Walk, Crouch End** trees this afternoon from Crouch Hill bridge where you can look directly into the mid-canopy of the largest elm. As expected, no territorial activity high up and a maximum of 2 wlh seen, but did locate one resting, crawling between leaves and occasionally flying small distances - record shot attached. Other butts around very active, Comma, Holly Blue and Small White - Tristan Bantock

I had a look around **Great Ashby Park** this afternoon, mainly around the entrance by Dixons roundabout, looking for White-letter Hairstreaks. I found 10+ feeding on thistle between 5.45 - 6.45pm, a few looked very fresh. Also seen 1 Red Admiral, hundreds of Meadow Brown and Small Skippers, 5 Marbled Whites, Large Skippers, Ringlets and Spotted Burnets - Steve Lane

Three Silver-washed Fritillary today, 7th July, at **Bricket Wood**, along with 2 Comma, 2 White Admiral, 1 Red Admiral, 1 Marbled white, 30+ Ringlet, Meadow Browns and 2 Large Skipper - Bob Cripps (field trip there Sunday)

Broxbourne Wood NR Field trip report: quite a few people arrived throughout the day all hoping to see **Purple Emperor.** Unfortunately several went home disappointed, 1 tatty male was eventually found in one of the clearings and allowed several observers to get a photo. At 3.30 one flew across the main ride and back and that was it! White Admirals very thin on the ground as well. However, numerous Purple Hairstreak, including some low down giving good views. Lots of Ringlets and Meadow Brown, a few skippers. Also reported throughout the day were Small Tortoiseshell, Red Admiral, Commas, Painted Lady, Holly Blue, whites, large Skipper and new generation Peacocks - various recorders (no Speckled Woods - later confirmed that one was photographed early morning!)

Thursday 5th July

News from 4th - Today (04/07/07) while doing a little casual birding, if there is such a thing, in **Northaw Great Wood**, my companion and I spotted a Silver-washed Fritillary. We located it on the yellow trail along the boundary with the Cuffley Camp Ground. It was in the first small open glade along the path as you head up hill after you turn right at the gate displaying the Camp Ground sign. It was spotted at approx 12:30 flying in the sunshine after a few light showers. Its size and its bright rufous colouration was most striking. It then settled on some vegetation and basked in the sunshine for some 4 minutes when we were able to observe it, both using Leica 10 x 50 binoculars. What Yvonne Benting and I noticed was that there were small stripes rather than spots on the forewing which for me identified it as a Silver-washed Fritillary and possibly a male. - Ian Thompson

I was searching in vain on **Royston Heath** but was then directed by a non-butterfly man who gave a perfect description of Marbled White and gave me the location of the colony. Extreme east

of the heath at approx TL351402 The density of butterflies is as good as you ever get anywhere with sightings of two per minute or greater. Often five visible at once. Attached picture. But a further visit to the main Chalkhill Blue area to south of fairway no 10 was hugely disappointing. There is an electric fence to control sheep grazing and the turf has been eaten down to a very short sward. Not a flower of any sort to be seen (this is where the Pasque Flowers are abundant in the spring). It seems to be very heavily over grazed and I have never seen it in in this state before in the 15 years I have lived in this area - Jack Harrison (note Sharon Hearle (regional officer) is aware of the problems at Therfield Heath)

Found new spot for Marbled Whites just of the end of **St Albans Lane, on the Hemel Hempstead to St. Albans road.** They were flying just off the roadside verge and into some private land. It looked a good colony I counted 8 around me in 3 or 4 minutes - Clive Burrows

News for today (Thurs 5th July 2007) - 1 Large White, at Lake Side, N14; 2 Red Admiral, (1 at Williams Wood, 1 at Vicarage Farm); 24+ Ringlet, (10 set-aside field near Shaws Wood, 14+ at Vicarage Farm); 6 male Gatekeeper, (1 set-aside field near Shaws Wood, 4 at Vicarage Farm); 1 female Large Skipper, at Vicarage Farm. Also saw a Red Admiral on buddleia outside my flat at Southgate today - the first butterfly I have seen on this bush so far this year - Robert Callf.

Grove Farm, most of the butterflies were seen in the meadow area in 8/8 overcast. Made the whites easier to ID as they actually stopped now and then. 4x White, of which 3 were identified (2 Small, 1 GV), the 4th I suspect might have been a Large but not sure. 2x Meadow Brown (1m, 1f), 1x Small Skipper (Male, light brown antennae), 1x Small Tortoiseshell, 1x Very tatty Speckled Wood, 1x Suspected Common Carpet Moth Plenty of micros around. 1x Suspected Emperor Dragonfly - Mike Rubin

Wednesday 4th July

W.L. & Purple Hairstreak observed on Ash, wednesday midday **Coppetts Wood**. Also Holly Blue - Tony Clancy

Saw 4 White letter Hairstreaks on the field by **Great Ashby Park**, close to the entrance of Pryors Wood,on 3rd July between 11-12 - Darrel Bryant

I went to **Great Ashby Park** this afternoon for 30 mins and saw 5 White Letter Hairstreak, 10 + Meadow Brown 2 Ringlet and 4 Small Skipper - Darin Stanley Ian Hardy - P S These were all seen close to the gate.

Tuesday 3rd July

This afternoon I had a wander around woods just south of **Stevenage** and considering the thunder, showers etc. it was very rewarding. I saw lots of different butterflies but the highlights were 2 seperate marbled white, commas, skippers (not sure which) many red admirals, ringlet I think and (I'm pretty certain) a **silver-washed fritillary**. It settled on a large leaf of a wild raspberry cane (just inside the gate from the meadow at the north-west entrance to the wood) and stayed for 5 or 6 minutes with wings fully open flat. When it took off I couldn't get a look at the underwing and I had no guide with me but subsequently looking at the Woodlands for Butterflies leaflet the picture confirmed my sighting - Don Gregory

Did my Ware Park transect in a good sunny spell between the showers and was very pleased to get another White Letter hairstreak, this time perched on a lucerne plant at the edge of a big arable field (but near elms), a Small Heath (first here since 1999), Marbled White (first here since 2000) and 4 Small Tortoiseshells (most in one week since 1998), among other more common species - Andrew wood

I saw 4 White Letter Hairstreak, 2 Ringlet, 1 Marbled White and 20 + Meadow Brown in a 20 min walk in **Great Ashby Park** - Ian Hardy

Batford Irrigation Pond, during limited lunch & between showers located 2 Gate Keepers, 4 Marbled Whites, Meadow Browns - Darin Stanley

The sooner they die off the better - Mike Rubin

4 wilh over the elm at **Cheshunt Golf Course**. **Wormley Woods**, five or so white admirals, several commas, ringlets, large skippers, small skippers, **one gatekeeper**, red admirals, no purple emperor sightings. Sometime ago the bramble bank inside the entrance at Derry's Wood (south side) has been flailed and all that's grown back are just cleavers & nettles. None of the barmble nectar there anymore - just some small brambles in the other corners - Terry Goddard & Andrew Middleton

News for the weekend is as follows -(Sat 30th June 2007)- Trent Park - saw 2 Ringlet, in set-aside field near Shaws Wood and 2 male Gatekeeper, (1 settled on window pane of Uni-building, 1 set-aside field N of Williams Wood. (Sun 1st July 2007) - 1 male Small Skipper, 1 female Large Skipper, 5 Meadow Brown and 2 Small/ Green-veined White at Cheyne Walk Open Space, N21. 1 Red Admiral and 1 Holly Blue at Halewood Hse., Southbury Rd., Enfield Town - Robert Callf.

Sunday 1st July

We decided to brave the weather and go out locally today to look for Purple Emperor. We went to Goose Green at 8.30 but unable to park, so we went to Danemead instead. When we got to the track where we have seen PE in previous years, it was so muddy,& flooded we gave up. We then went to **Broxbourne Woods** and arrived at 9.45, weather windy and wet. Saw lots of Meadow Browns and Ringlets. Weather brightened up later in the day and during this time we also saw Large White, Large Skipper, White Admirals, Red Admirals, Commas and Purple Hairstreaks. At about 3.30 we into the clearing of the nature reserve and saw our first **Purple Emperor** of the year, it was high in a Silver Birch being blown around and was hanging on for its dear life, we watched it for approx 15mins before it flew towards the main track. We also saw many Purple Hairstreaks in this section and Small Skippers. We left at 5.15 - Sandra and Kevin Standbrige

I visited **Park Wood, Ruislip** this afternoon when the sun came out but no luck searching for PE. I did see my **first Gatekeeper** of the year plus 7 White Admiral, 5 Red Admiral, 4 Comma, 4 Purple Hairstreak, 7 Essex Skipper, 2 Small Skipper, Large Skipper, 2 Large White, 3 Small White, 6+ Ringlet, 4 Speckled Wood and many Meadow Browns. Steve Pash

Despite the fairly overcast conditions early on, todays joint LNHS/BC walk at **Horsenden** was a real success. Dave and myself were joined by two members of the Horsenden ranger team and 8 LNHS/BC members. We got straight into the White-letter Hairstreaks with one sat low down on elm just to the rear of Horsenden Farm, right at the start of the walk. There was some argument over the identification until we realised that it was sat about a foot away from a Purple Hairstreak and that both camps were correct - we were looking at two different butterflies! Once that was resolved it proved a nice opportunity to view these two hairstreaks side-by-side. The walk produced 14 species in sub-optimal conditions: White-letter Hairstreak (3+), Purple Hairstreak (10+), Holly Blue (2), Green-veined White (4), Gatekeeper (8), Meadow Brown (common), Small Skipper (2 and several undetermined Small/Essex), Small Copper (1), Marbled White (1), Large Skipper (1), Ringlet (1 - probably only the 2nd record for the site), Comma (1), Large White (1), Small White (3). The weather perked up a bit after the walk was over and we added 3 further species - Red Admiral, Speckled Wood and Painted Lady - as well as getting better counts of some species. For example, it was pretty good for Comma today and they were all in pristine condition.

Overall numbers for the walk and subsequent transect for key species were: White-letter Hairstreak (4+), Marbled White (3+). The white-letter count is conservative as it concerns 7 sightings. The main excitement for Dave and me was the Ringlet. We saw it flash by and were immediately taken by the dark colouration, apparent lack of orange tones and the obvious white fringe. Luckily it didn't go far and everyone was able to enjoy this rarity - see the attached. I've also attached a fairly poor White-letter photograph. They weren't that accommodating today. Although we had at least 3 nectaring throughout the day and enjoyed good views, they were generally a little too high, a bit tatty or a little too deep into the bramble to get good photos - Andrew Culshaw (joint leader)

Symondshyde Woods - 2+ White Admiral, several Green veined whites, 5+ Ringlets & 1 Humming bird Hawk moth (where's all the White Letter Hairstreaks???) **Hexton** - 1 Large Skipper, several Ringlets (generally devoid of life, guessing cause of the hurricane type winds & Mixed bag of weather) Nearby Sharoenhoe Clappers, Beds - 3 Dark Green Fritillaries - Darin Stanley

I joined the butterfly walk at **Horsenden Hill** today. It was a bit showery but fairly warm and still some sunshine at times so plenty of butterflies around. It was a good start with a Purple and White Letter Hairstreak seen on the same tree. I saw the following species: White Letter Hairstreak - At last! 2 seen nectaring after the main walk. Got close. Purple Hairstreak Meadow Browns by the hundred even flying in the rain. Small, Essex and Large Skippers. Gatekeeper - my first ones of the year. Ringlet - Only the 2nd ever recorded at Horsenden Hill apparently. Photos taken in the rain! Marbled White - just the one. Painted Lady - one spotted at warp factor 6. Holly Blue. What did I miss? Someone reported Small Copper too. Also saw a number of miscellaneous moths. And those (censored) horseflies! Good to meet everyone on that walk. And nice to see the pre-caught moths (light traps) on display, and then to watch them as they were released again. Also nice to take it slow instead of a rushed lunchbreak walk. JUNE 2007

Friday 29th June

Following up a report from a Bengeo environmental club pupil of a Marbled White sighting, Alan Downie visited a field close to **Stapleford** village today and found numerous Marbled Whites, mating Large Skipper, Meadow Browns, a single lonely Ringlet and an **Essex Skipper**. The field apparently is fantastic!

Went to **Bricket Wood** this afternoon and saw: one red admiral, two speckled woods, one large white, two white admirals, one purple hairstreak, and four meadow browns - Dave Mackenzie

Managed to stop off briefly at **Hexton** again today on the way home from work. I was surprised by the number of marbled whites - I saw 12+. Also saw small heath (4), ringlet(4), meadow brown(6) & speckled wood(3). - Gavin Vicary

News for today (Fri 29th June 2007) is as follows: 1 White-letter Hairstreak, behind bus-stop, opposite Oakwood tube; 2 Painted Lady, at 'New Fields', Trent Park; 2 Ringlet, at 'New Fields'; 3 Small Copper, at 'New Fields'- summer-brood is about 1 or 2 weeks early this year, in line with spring emergence; 2 male Gatekeeperr, at 'New Fields'; 11 Red Admiral, (7 in Trent Park, 1 Parkside Farm, 3 Vicarage Farm); 7 Comma, at Trent Park; 10 Small Heath, (9 at 'New Fields', 1 at Vicarage Farm); 1 male Large Skipper, at Vicarage Farm; 1 Small Tortoiseshell, summer-brood, along Leeging Beech Gutter at Vicarage Farm - Robert Callf.

I had a walk around **Cornmill Meadows** (which I think is actually Essex), mainly looking for dragonflies, but found my fisrt and second Gatekeeper of the year, also Red Admiral, Large, Small and Green-veined White, Ringlet, Comma, Small Tortoiseshell, Large Skipper and Meadow Brown - Steve Lane and David Beer

On a birding visit this morning, I saw 2 Marbled Whites - which I have never recorded at **Tyttenhanger** before. Also 2 Gatekeeper, 2 Ringlet, 1 Small Tortoiseshell, 1 Small Skipper, c10 Meadow Browns, c10 Large Whites - David Booth

Good variety of species at **Lake Farm Country Park**, **Hayes**, this morning in between the showers. In about 1.5 hours counted approximately 4 Small Skippers, 1 Large Skipper, 37 Small or Green-veined Whites, 1 Holly Blue, 3 Red Admirals, 7 Small Tortoiseshell, 1 Gatekeeoer (first of year) and 23 Meadow Browns - Peter Naylor

Not sent in sightings recently for **Brent Reservoir** but managed a transect yesterday (Thursday 28th) during brief sunnyish spell. Total of 150 insects of thirteen species including 21 Marbled White. Had a single W-L Hairstreak last Saturday (23rd) - Roy Beddard

Two Dark Green Frits at **Aldbury Nowers** yesterday - good close views on musk thistle, so no probs with ID. - Martin Hicks

Thursday 28th June

PM (After 17.30) butterflies at Symondshyde Woods in the brief sunshine we had: 3 White

Admiral, 3 Purple Hairstreak - Darin Stanley

I went to **Great Ashby Park** this afternoon and in 40 mins saw 20+ Meadow Browns, 4 Marbled White, 3 Large Skippers and 2 Ringlet - Ian Hardy

Just had a very productive afternoon watching butterflies (11.30 - 14.40 BST), here follows a list of my sightings: 1 White-letter Hairstreak, settled low down on Wych Elm behind bus-stop, opposite Oakwood tube; 2 Purple Hairstreak, 1 settled on grass near Oakwood entrance and 1 near Church Wood; 6 Ringlet, 5 at 'New Fields', 1 set-aside field N of Williams Wood; 2 Small Heath, 'New Fields'; 2 Small Copper, 'fresh' second-brood, 'New Fields'; 1 Speckled Wood, along tube-line near Cockfoster's entrance; 3 Red Admiral, 2 'New Fields', 1 edge of Moat Wood; 2 Painted Lady, at 'New Fields'; 4 Large Skipper, 3 at 'New Fields', 1 female, set-aside field N of Williams Wood; 15 Comma, at Trent Park - 5 at 'New Fields', 3 on bramble by Lower Lake, 1 edge of Moat Wood and 6 together around bramble-patch, N of Williams Wood; 2 male Gatekeeper, edge of Church Wood (my first of the year); 1 Green-veined White, settled near Church Wood; 1 Small Tortoiseshell, fresh 'summer-brood', near Sport's Field; 1 Marbled White, edge of Moat Wood (my first of the year) - Robert Callf

Broxbourne Wood NR - butterfly walk this morning. Despite a cloudy outlook, there were several sunny breaks which allowed everyone to see several Red Admirals, meadow browns, ringlets, large and small skipper and a comma and speckled wood. Purple Hairstreak were active in the tree tops and 3 White Admiral were seen on ride side oak and sallows. None came down to the brambles whilst we were there just staying higher up making the most of the sunshine - various recorders

Wednesday 27th June

A short walk in Enfield Town today (Weds 27th June 2007) produced 1 Large White, at Enfield Grammar School Playing Field and 1 Red Admiral at Town Park - Robert Callf

Horsenden Hill, found and photographed my first 2007 Marbled White today. Was rather overcast at the time but it was still active. Disturbed several resting (and hidden until they took flight) Meadow Browns and millions of Grasshoppers stalking it. Then beaten into the woods by a swarm of those irritating horseflies. Up the hill a Red Admiral Whizzed past me, and disturbed a Comma. In the grazing field near the top found a 5-spot burnet feeding in the gloom. (Or is it narrow bordered 5-spot?) Then it started raining lightly. Still to work out how to spot a WL Hairstreak! Let alone photograph one. Even when the sun briefly poked through a hole to briefly light up the elms - Mike Rubin

Park Wood Ruislip, Meadow brown 3, Small skipper male 1 - Sezar Heimet

Tuesday 26th June

Grove Farm, went on a short walk after a lunchtime meeting to find one each of Large Skipper, Large White, Small Tortoiseshell and Meadow Brown despite the almost total overcast. Was nice to see anything after the last few days! - Mike Rubin

along the south side of the public footpath in the northern half of the southern compartment. Also plenty of Marbled Whites and Ringlets throughout the Reserve - Tim Hill

News from Cherry Eggleton - **13th June:** Red Admiral for 3rd year running, lays eggs on nettles in plant container, **Westminster, Central London. 15th June 2007: Clifford Road allotment site, North Brent** - 70 Peacock caterpillars, full size found on nettles allotment plot. By 17th only 10 remained - could not find pupa

Spent a couple of hours in **Bricket Wood Thursday** afternoon. Despite the continuing unsettled weather saw 3 White Admirals, 2 Red Admiral, 3 Meadow Browns and singletons of Ringlet and Large Skipper - Clive Burrows

Thursday 21st June

I had my first marbled white of the year on Horsenden Hill this evening. Stunning views,

obviously, since I didn't have my camera with me. It was on the rough grassy area opposite The Ballot Box - Bramstons Green South. Nothing else of note - 56+ Swifts about the best. I recorded **33 Marbled White today**, 17/6/2007, again they were on the waste land adjacent to the **M1/M25**. On my local patch around Abbots Langley I also recorded, Small/Essex 1, Large Skipper 1, Brimstone 1(female|), Large White 1, Green-veined White 1, Common Blue 2, Red Admiral 4,Small Tortoiseshell 10,Peacock 1, Common 1, Meadow Brown 22 - Bob Cripps

Three White Admirals along the main north-south ride on the **Bricket Wood** transect today; also 24 Meadow Browns (including at least one female), six Large Skippers, two Large Whites (or one mobile individual), two Red Ads (ditto), two Small Torts and a Speckled Wood. Nearby at **Munden Spring** a White-letter Hairstreak nectaring on bramble flowers. Disappointing to see that Harlequin Ladybirds now seem to be spreading into these more rural areas - Colin Everett

2 White-Letter Hairstreak **Totteridge Valley**, also Painted Lady & Large Skippers. Sunday Morning - Tony Clancy

Saturday 16th June

Just had a look behind the bus-stop opposite **Oakwood tube** after a heavy shower and observed at least **4 White-letter Hairstreak** around a Lime tree and the Wych Elms here; also 1 Red Admiral and 1 Small White here (13.55 - 14.00 hrs.) - Robert Callf.

Wormwood Scrubs field trip, "Come and have a look at this moth" said Margaret. It was in some-ones' cupped hands. The lady gently open her hands and there was a **Purple Hairstreak;** a new record for the site. We had to shelter in the Lindford Christie Stadium near the end of the walk as the heavons opened. Six other species were seen and the faint call of the nesting Meadow Pipit was heard - John Holllingdale

Thursday 14th June

Despite the forecast went to the **London Borough of Hackney** today to seek out the elms mentioned in this leaflet and in particular elms in Millfields Park South, St John of Jerusalem Church and Hackney Downs. The trees at these sites are truly huge, and in moments of sunshine between cloud we had white-letter activity at all three sites. The problem is that because the trees are so tall, the butterflies look absolutely minute and it takes awhile to be certain that the small skitty thing seen on the top of the elm really is white-letter. Quite amazing and probably the first records from these trees. For instance around Millfields Park there was no visible nectar so they must be surviving on the elm or London Plane honeydew and its not surprising that no one has seen one there - Liz Goodyear and Andrew Middleton

June 13th: was walking on **Northchurch Common** (the big grassy field next to the Northchurch - Ringshall road) and spotted a **grizzled skipper**, it was some way into the field amongst the long grass which seemed an odd location for it. Wasn't really there for the butterflies but did notice a half a dozen or so meadow browns and three painted ladies as well - Colin Sturges

It always seems to rain on my days off just lately, but the sun did show for about 30 minutes today, just long enough for a quick walk around **Great Ashby** Park. I saw lots of Meadow Browns, Common Blues, 3 Large Skippers and a Painted Lady, then it rained again! Steve Lane

We saw White Admiral and Silver-washed Fritillary at Park Heath Corner(the Sussex branch reserve) yesterday + Small P/B. The first two had only emerged that day - John Hollingdale

Wednesday 13th June

Just a few sightings today (Weds 13th June 2007) - 2 Holly Blue, 1 at Old Park Avenue, 1 male, at Town Park on dog's muck 'taking minerals'; also 1 Large White along Gentleman's Row, Enfield Town - Robert Callf

Tuesday 12th June

Omitted to say that we had our first **Horsenden** Meadow Brown on the same day as the W-I Hairstreaks - just the one on **9th June**. My garden moth trap in Greenford (basically ajojning Horsenden Hill) has also had single **Buttoned Snouts** on two recent dates - 24th May and 9th June. Dave Howdon and I also had two Buttoned Snout to MV in Perivale Wood on 25th May - Andy Culshaw

Just made an unplanned detour via **Park Wood Ruislip** on the way home from work as the cloud had completely broken up and it was gorgeous out in the breeze. It was well worth the trip... **1 x White Admiral** - My first of the year. Very fresh! It was basking on a fern leaf but shot off high

into the trees before I could get close. $2-3 \times Small Skipper - My first of the year too. I think the Large Skippers were still around too. <math>1 \times Red Admiral$. The usual Green Oak Tortrixes, Straw Dots and other miscellaneous moths. No sign of Marbled White yet. But I imagine not long now. I wandered along the main bridleway too but no hairstreaks seen. They are starting to annoy me. Small Skipper and White Admiral (long range):

First **White Admiral** at **Balls Wood** this morning, beautiful condition, also Comma, a couple of meadow Brown, Large skippers, Painted Lady, Red Admiral and of course speckled Wood - Andrew Wood

Just had a text message from Andrew Middleton forwarded from Colin Jupp to say that at 7.15 this evening Colin saw a pristine Purple Hairstreak on foliage at Weald Park in Essex

Alexandra Palace - mirroring occurrences elsewhere in the region I had a minimum of eight individuals (**White-letter Hairstreak**) this afternoon, flitting above the tops of ashes and a maple, and obtained good views when they landed. I was joined by Gareth Richards and Andrew Gardener, at this site traditionally known as the Seascouts. Opposite the allotments and adjacent to the Farmer's Market, this glade is the most productive site within the park, and has usually hosted a few individuals in the past but this is the largest known gathering on one date. There are runt elms present. Also had my first Painted Lady for the year in the Conservation Area - Bob Watts

Harpenden, my first summer season Red Admiral in the garden today, very lively and in perfect condition. Also Brimstone - Robin Pearson

Saturday 9th June

Not part of the White-letter project but we went into central London today, to visit elms identified during winter searches. As it was still cloudy we went to **Battersea Park** first (south of the Thames). We had visited the park in January and identified all the areas of elm - this. We first stopped at Rosery Gate and after a few minutes we saw 3/4 white-letters flying around elm and ash just above gatekeepers cottage. We visited the other elms but nothing seen but returning a further two were seen on ash. From there we went to **Hyde Park** and found 4 Siberian elms close to Rotten Row which are discussed in LNHS literature, almost immediately we saw a White-letter fly, a second individual was also seen. We then tried to locate elm noted elsewhere in the Royal Parks but with less success. Since this is only the second day since emergence, not every site will be active yet - Liz Goodyear and Andrew Middleton

Continuing the early White-letter Hairstreak theme, Dave Howdon, Simon Smethurst and myself had at least two on **Horsenden Hill** this afternoon, 9th June. There has to be a question mark as to whether they will still be around for the joint LNHS/BC walk in 3 weeks time - Andy Culshaw

On Friday afternoon, June 8th, in overcast conditions, I saw a solitary Painted Lady on the disused railway sidings North of **Croxley Common Moor**. (This was where, last year in late July, there were huge numbers of Painted Ladies feeding on the buddleias that are abundant there.) - Graham Elcombe

White-letter Hairstreak, had a look on Parkland Walk at midday today when sun came out properly. No bins, but 4-6 small dark, butterflies spiralling and clashing over a sycamore near the elms between **Crouch hill and Mountview rd.** On return at 12.45 did not notice activity. This site is very warm and sheltered and has a lot of heat loving insects, so might be a particularly early one even by London standards - Tristan Bantock

Park Wood, Ruislip, caught a brief spell of hazy sunshine just after lunch. Still no Heath Fritillaries or Red Admirals. Didn't spot any Hairstreaks either. And the sun soon got swallowed by the clouds again. But... 10+x Speckled Wood - they were all over the bridleway. 4x Meadow Brown - my first of the year. 3x Painted Lady - 2 slightly faded and one looking pretty fresh. Got a super closeup photo of the fresh one as increasingly dull conditions were making it more docile although it was still pretty active. I guess the immigration has arrived good and proper. 2x Large Skipper, 2x Silver Y, 1x PEACOCK! Slightly tattered but colours still bright. Basking in dull 8/8 conditions. Lots of Green Oak Tortrix and other unidentified moths too. Got ants in my pants after the clouds cleared mid aftenoon. Headed out to **Barnhill** to burn some more energy. 5x Large Skipper, 4x Meadow Brown (3m, 1f), 2x Painted Lady, 2x Red Admiral, 1x Speckled Wood, 1x Small White 1x PEACOCK! (Condition unknown -flying), Zillions of Burnet Companions swarming the meadows. I did keep an eye on oak and other trees with Hairstreaks in mind but nothing noteworthy spotted. - Mike Rubin

Forty Hall, Enfield – two meadow browns, plus one small copper and 30+ mother shiptons. Searched a large bank of elm in north Enfield for an early white-letter, but no luck yet – Andrew Middleton

MAY 2007

Thursday 31st May

7/8ths cloud cover but for the first time in ages some fleeting sunshine and not raining. So went over **Horsenden Hill.** North side spotted my first Large Skipper of the year on a blackberry bush during a brief sunny spell. Near the summit spotted my first Mother Shipton moth of the year. Also spotted what looked like a Green Oak Tortrix which was very tatty, right wing severely damaged could barely fly. South side spotted a Red Admiral in the grazing meadow. Other than that, nothing! No whites even. - Mike Rubin

Monday 28th May

Aldbury Nowers - I went to Aldbury Nowers again on the **26th May** but not as much about as last week - too grey. Saw 4 Burnet Companion, and 2 Common Blue, a Large White, 2 Small Coppers and a Cinnabar moth - Martin Parr

Saturday 26th May

I spent some time at **Aldbury Nowers** last **Sunday 20th May** from about 11.00 til 3.00 odd. I was looking for Dingy and grizzled skippers and green hairstreaks - all life firsts for me, and found dingy and hairstreak! So was pretty pleased. Hope to try for grizzled again tomorrow. I didn't keep a full count of everything seen but thought the list I did keep may be useful to you:- Green Hairstreak 3 minimum - possibly 7 as saw 2 dog fighting that disapperaed over the trees, then 10 minutes and 20 minutes later 2 more still fighting - so either a long fight or more than one pair. Dingy skipper 2 - one in the left hand paddock, one out at the back of the meadow from the layby. Holly Blue 1, Mother Shipton 2, treble bar 3, Cinnebar 3, Peacock 3, Small Tortoiseshell 1, Brown Argus 3. Brimstone, Small copper, Small heath, all lots. Green veined white 1 min and other whites couldn't pin down as too far and fast. Also noted an infestation of caterpillers on the road there from the station - 4 - 5 lots on both sides - Martin Parr

Friday 25th May

Aldbury Nowers today, Diane Andrew's and I spent a couple of hours on site and saw **1 Large Skipper**, 20 Small Heath, 4 Common Blue, 3 Brown Argus, 5 Small Copper, 17 Brimstone, 1 Large White, 1 Speckled Wood, 1 Peacock, 3 Mother Shipton, 5 Burnet Companion, 1 Small Yellow Underwing, 7 Cinnabar, 5 Treble-bar, 1 Common Swift, 5 Yellowshell and 2 Red Kites. Failed to see Dingy, Grizzled or Green Hairstreak. **Whilst we were there someone else had there car broken into in the lay-by.** Then we when over the border to Church End just in Bucks and in deteriorating weather picked up 3 Small Blue, 2 Dingy Skipper and heard Quail - Andrew Palmer

News for today - 3 Speckled Wood, at Trent Park near Equestrian Centre; 2 Peacock at Trent Park (1 edge of Shaws Wood, 1 set-aside field N of Williams Wood); 2 Small Heath, set-aside field near Shaws Wood; 1 Cinnabar Moth, set-aside field N of Williams Wood; 2, male and female, Common

Alan Titchmarsh incorrectly identified it as a Swallowtail & that it would have to travel to Norfolk to find a mate. The pictures of it were good & there can be no doubt it was a Scarce Swallowtail. It was said to have hatched in Chelsea, arriving as a pupa imported from Italy. This appears to be a rare sighting. Colin Plants "Butterflies of the London Area" (1987) records no previous sightings in Middx, though interestingly there was one seen close by in Richmond Park on 20th September 1829! - Malcolm Hull

Horsenden Hill, wandered around the fields West of the hill again (different route this time) today at lunchtime. One settled in front of me and was not tatty at all, and quite active (definitely not elderly like). Female? Also saw 1 Red Admiral, 1 small Copper and 1 Small tortoiseshell. No whites!!! Pretty quiet. Mid afternoon siesta in the heat I guess. (I was late cos a boring and irritating lunchtime meating postponed my lunchbreak. **22nd May Grove Farm,** short lunchtime walk in the sunshine. Was surprised to find 3 Common Blues (1f,2m) not far from the David Lloyd centre just off the footpath on a small patch of grass / paths / bench. Had no idea they were in the area. Also several small unid'd moths. Also saw 2 speckled woods in the wood, and 1 green veined white on Whitton Avenue - Mike Rubin

Aldbury Nowers news from 17th May - Top paddock, 3 Dingy Skipper, 1 Green Hairstreak, 1 Common Blue, 4 Brown Argus, 1 Small Copper, 1 Large White, 1 Small White, 1 Peacock, no Grizzled Skipper, 3 Pyrausta nigrata. Southern section: 2 Dingy Skipper, 5 Small Heath. 2 Small Copper, 1 Green-veined White, 2 Silver-ground Carpet, 1 Mother Shipton - Andrew Palmer

Thursday 17th May

First visited **Pegsdon Hills**, in drizzle or dull conditions, and found 3 roosting Dingy Skipper. Walked up to **Telegraph Hill** and found 2 roosting/semi active Dingy Skipper and 4 eggs! Drove on to **Hexton** and the sun came out and immediately found 5 Burnet Companions. We then walked up one side of the pit in sunshine and counted **14 active Dingy Skippers** including a mating pair. As we walked back down the other side cloud returned and they started to roost up and we saw 10 more - a total of 24! Also seen, Brimstone, 1 Green Hairstreak and 1 Small Heath - Liz Goodyear & Andrew Middleton

Waterford Heath south, late afternoon - 16 Grizzled Skipper roosting across pit - Andrew Middleton

Again rather overcast, but a bit brighter than yesterday. This time I wandered between the **Canal and Horsenden Lane North**. Despite the conditions the Small Coppers were out in force. In summary the total number species sightings I have made at the Mudchute site during this butterfly season remains at seven. I return to Mudchute for my second lunchtime field trip walk of the season on Wednesday July 11th [12.30pm] - David Chandler

Horsenden Hill, pretty overcast, but still spotted a few leps. An early bright spell on the north side revealed a Small Copper and what looked like a Pyrausta Aurata (got photo, will confirm later). Saw a single White on the South Side near the grazing fields. Then in the meadows on the west side below the road it started raining lightly. Despite that I got buzzed by what must have been a red admiral (all peacocks gone now I think.) Plenty of unidentified small moths around though - Mike Rubin

Visited **Vicarage Farm,** Enfield for 1 hour yesterday evening (Tuesday 15th May 2007) and saw only one butterfly - a Small Heath - Robert Callf

Monday 14th May

Aldbury Nowers after the rain, 3 roosting Dingy Skipper, 2 Small Copper, 2 Brown Argus but no Grizzled Skipper found. **Waterford Heath north**, 1 Grizzled Skipper - Andrew Palmer

Saturday 12th May

Waterford Heath Field Trip Report: The weather could have been better, but the worst of the rain held off until we just got back to the carpark - we were very lucky! Eight people joined Alan Downie to search the north pit for Grizzled Skipper. Two roosting individuals were located and in a moment of sunshine, opened their wings for everyone to see their markings. 22 Brown Argus were counted either roosting or in flight and 1 Small Copper was found roosting. Several Treble/Lesser Treble Bar moths were flying around and caterpillars were found including Orange Tip larvae on garlic mustard - Liz Goodyear

Waterford Heath, an early morning roost count located 5 Grizzled Skipper across the north pit, also 11 Brown Argus, 1 Small Copper and 1 Common Blue. Scattered across the south pit, 6 Grizzleds were found, 2 Small Copper, 1 Brown Argus and a Speckled Wood - Liz Goodyear & Andrew Middleton

Friday 11th May

Not much to report this week, with the weather being the way it is. My sightings are as follows - **Monday 7th May 2007** - 3 Small Heath at Vicarage Farm; 1 Large White and 1 Small White, along Leeging Beech Gutter near Water Garden, Trent Park. **Wednesday 9th May 2007** - 1 Small Copper, along Merryhill's Brook at South Lodge Farm - Robert Callf

Wednesday 9th May

Had my first ever visit to **Hexton Chalk Pit** today and a very interesting place it is too. Not much to report on the lepidoptera front on a dingy morning, just one dingy skipper, but had good views of willow warbler and blackcap and the cow-slips were nice. Rather bizarrely there were pheasants eggs strewn about the place, by a fox I presume, and also a dead mole - Robin Pearson

Sunday 6th May

TWO DAYTIME MOTHS FOR THIS BANK HOLIDAY WEEKEND Those people who are out and about at the moment looking for Grizzled and Dingy Skippers might also look out for two target day-flying moths on chalky sites in Hertfordshire. As some people object to attachments, I have uploaded photographs of the moth, taken by Tristan Bantock, to my web space and the links are given below. The Small Purple-barred is a macro moth that should be flying about in the afternoon sunshine today and tomorrow. The caterpillar feeds on Common Milkwort and Heath Milkwort. In flight, it might be overlooked and ignored as one of the common Pyrausta (pyralids). The other

species is the pyralid moth Pyrausta nigrata – jet black with white lines across the wings. The foodplants are Marjoram, Thyme and other labiates. Both are apparently rare in Hertfordshire but are almost certainly just under-recorded. Both have been recorded flying at Aldbury Nowers in the last few days and Pyrausta nigrata has also been seen at Hexton Chalk Pit. Both would be worth looking for all along the north edge of the county from Royston in the east to Tring in the west. If you are on the chalk along our border with Cambridgeshire, you might also keep a look out for the Four-spotted moth. This nationally rare species is now on the wing (rather earlier than normal – but then so are many other things). In rapid flight it can look confusingly like a Grizzled Skipper. There are many other day-flying moths, of course, in addition to these poorly recorded ones. I want all records of all species STRAIGHT AWAY PLEASE – don't wait for the end of the year as that would be too late for inclusion in the book. Good Hunting! Colin Plant

Had a trip out on Saturday first, out of county to Bedfordshire. A bit to overcast, but we did manage 2 Duke of Burgundy, 1 Small Copper and 1 Small White. Second stop was **Hexton Chalk Pit**, 8+ Dingy Skipper and a Small White - Trevor Brownsell, Keith Cherry, Tony Hukin and Steve Lane

During the last week in my **Stevenage garden**, numbers of Holly Blue, Speckled Wood and Orange Tip increasing, Large, Small and Green-veined White, Peacock also seen - Steve Lane

Went on Friday to two of my under recorded tetrads at **Cassiobury Park and Croxley Common Moor.** Saw plenty of orange tips, small/green-veined whites, a couple of peacocks, red admirals and brimstones and a single speckled wood. But the highlight of the day were small heaths posing in the gusty conditions and several small coppers including a mating pair! Earlier this week at the Swillet I had seen mating holly blues. This is a first for me with both species - Ann Piper

News for today - 1 Speckled Wood, Park Farm, also 1 in Rough Lot, **Trent Park** and 1 at Lakeside, **Oakwood**; 2 Peacock at Trent Park (1 by Upper Lake and 1 on the edge of Ride Wood); 1 male Brimstone by Lower Lake, Trent Park; 1 Small Copper basking on field edge of Ride Wood - a bit tatty around edge of hind-wing - a sign that it has been on the wing a while; 1 Green-veined White, edge of Ride Wood and a pair of Small White mating here also; 2 male Orange Tip - 1 Vicarage Farm and 1 edge of Ride Wood, Trent Park; 1 Large White, Park Farm also forgot to mention I saw 2 Comma on **Tuesday** - 1 at Park Farm and 1 at the Water Garden, Trent Park - Robert Callf

Wandered around Paradise Fields to the west of **Horsenden Lane North** this lunchtime. 4×6 Green Veined white (Settled / feeding and easy to look at thanks to initially cloudy conditions), 2×6 Speckled Wood (One albino? - white marks instead of yellow - Photographed.) 1×6 Small Tortoiseshell, 2×6 Peacock, 1×6 Male Orange Tip, 2×6 Small Copper, Several unidentified whites - Mike Rubin

Trent Park area news from **April 24th** - 2 male Orange Tip at Vicarage Farm and 2 males at Trent Park; 1 Peacock at Parkside Farm and 1 also at Park Farm and Trent Park; 1 Speckled Wood at Park Farm and 3 at Trent Park and 1 female Holly Blue settled at Park Farm - nice view! Robert Callf

Tuesday 24th April

Had a walk around ovaltine fields in **Abbots Langley** this afternoon, encountering 5 Peacocks, 6 small Tortoiseshells, singletons of Holly Blue, Orange Tip, Speckled Wood and Green-veined White - Clive Burrows

Paul Thrush and I had a quick look around **Aldbury** after a meeting and had **1 Dingy Skipper**, 2 Green Hairstreak and Paul had a **Grizzled**. Also Large White and Brown Argus. All in the key area of the northern enclosure. 24th is extraordinarily early for Dingy Skipper in Herts. The earliest in Brian's book is 30 April and the earliest in our database records (1996-) is also 30 April so this may be one of the earliest recorded. - Andrew Palmer

Much Hadham area, a setaside found last September produced **25 Small Coppers** in about 30 minutes including several clashing males, and a mating pair - Liz Goodyear and Andrew Middleton

This morning's rain cleared and sun came out at lunchtime just in time for a walk up **Horsenden Hill**. Very humid and muggy! $1 \times Small$ Copper photographed by brambles north side, $1 \times Small$ White by Horsenden Lane North, $1 \times Red$ Admiral just below summit west side. $2 \times Speckled$ Wood (1 photographed, another pale one), $2 \times Holly$ Blue, $8 \times Peacock$ (1 photographed) (Mostly on west side just below the Horsenden Lane north) Plenty of unidentified whites. Loads of Green Longhorn moths still on all sides of the hill. After I got back, $1 \times Holly$ unidentified caterpillar crawling up my trouser leg! (2cm, photographed) (Set it down on a leaf outside the office.) - Mike Rubin

Sunday 22nd April

Helen, Tristan and I went to **Wanstead Park** on Sunday, and found a White-letter egg, then found a large larva – must be only 2-3 few weeks at most from pupating – that would mean a possible late May date? Twice as big as I expected. Then we went to the Grizzled Skipper sites – with **4 at Frogmore** plus 2 small coppers, and none found for us early evening at Waterford - Andrew Middleton, Helen & Tristan Bantock

Friday 20th April

Managed **1 Grizzled Skipper** on **Waterford north**, and four roosting evening in **Frogmore Pit** – and none in an hour on Waterford south (just one probable). Small heath, small copper and brown argus also seen - Andrew Middleton

Had a walk this afternoon in the **Braughing Friars/ Albury area**. 3 male Orange tips, 2 Holly Blue, 3 Speckled woods many Peacocks 1 Small tortoiseshell - Ian Edwards

Not so many butterflies in my **Stevenage** garden today due to the cool wind, several visits from Orange tip and Small Whites, 1 Large White and a very territorial Peacock, which even flies up to see off the Blue Tits - Steve Lane

Thursday 19th April

We went back to **Waterford Heath South pit** at 3.00pm today, sunny and windy. Sandra saw the first **Grizzled Skipper** at 3.10pm at the bottom of the slope between the 2 piles of cleared sticks. We then continued having sightings until we left at 5.00pm. We think there were a least 4 different individuals with a total of 15 sightings. We also saw 2 clash, flying right out into the middle of the field. The others were flying up & down and feeding but mainly staying at the bottom of the slope. Picture attached Also saw 4 Peacocks, 1 comma, plus whites - Kevin & Sandra Standbridge

North Enfield, small copper Merryhills Brook, 2 re ads - **Trent Park and Park Farm**, also 4 peacock, 2 male orange tip, 3 male brimstone, 4 speckled wood - Robert Callf

I had a walk around **Tyttenhanger** today, pleanty of Small Whites and the odd **Large White**, several Orange tips around the stream, also Peacocks and Small Tortoiseshell - Steve Lane & Dave Beer

Horsenden Hill and surrounding fields today at lunchtime: 9 x Peacock, 2 x Holly Blue, 2 x Male Orange Tip, 2 x Speckled Wood, 2 x Small White (Sparring and then settled). Several unidentified whites. Zillions of Green Longhorn swarming on Oak and Hawthorn. On one south facing hedgerow they were there swarming along the whole length. **Grove Farm yesterday (18th)** - very short lunchtime walk. 1 x Male Orange Tip - it settled when a cloud cast its shadow, and I was able to take pictures. 1 x Speckled Wood, 1 x Holly Blue, No Peacocks. Several unidentified whites. Swarms of Green Longhorns observed high up on sunny side of several oak trees. I did not find that Small Copper again - Mike Rubin

Saw eight species in a half hour walk round **Maple Cross**. My largest sighting in one day so far this year! Perfect weather conditions. My first **Large White** of the year - definitely bigger than the other whites around! These included small, green-veined and orange tips. Two speckled woods were disputing territory. A number of holly blues were courting round a large holly tree on the field edge. Saw half a dozen peacocks at least and my first brimstone of the year - they seem less in evidence around this area - Ann Piper

Bowspirit Gardens in Millwall. It's a small green-space right next to the river Thames facing Rotherhithe over on the other bank. As I feared there was not a lot of green space, but there was sufficient nectar around to attract 6 Small Whites, 3 Holly Blues & a Small Tortoiseshell - Dave Chandler

Phone call from Andrew Palmer to say he has seen his first **Green Hairstreak** at **Aldbury Nowers**. Brimstones everywhere, also 2 Small Copper, Green-veined Whites and Peacocks. Later confirmed as **5 Green Hairstreak**

Wednesday 18th April

We went over to the south pit at **Waterford** at 4.20 and looked around for 45 mins. Unfortunately no Grizzled Skipper but we did see our first **Small Copper**, a Small Tortoiseshell, 2 Peacocks and a Large Red Damselfly. We then went to the North Pit at 5.15pm and had no sightings, we left at 5.45, it was sunny but windy. We started the day at **Pegsdon Hills (Bedfordshire)** and saw our first Green Hairstreaks of the year at 10.30am at the end of the valley. There was alot of movement and it is difficult to give exact numbers but approx 12 were seen. Sunny and cloudy, left at 12.00pm. Elsewhere in **Bedfordshire**, we were lucky to have 2 sightings of a Grizzled Skipper, also saw Speckled Wood and Peacocks - Sandra and Kevin Standbridge

A few butterfly sightings; quite a few Peacocks around everywhere. **Tyttenhanger**, male Orange Tip, two others seen in vicinity on the **17th April**. Plenty of Garlic Mustard food plants. Frogmore lakes, St Albans - Speckled Wood, Holly Blue. Orange Tip also seen nearby - Alan Gardiner

Waterford Heath - an afternoon visit still couldn't produce a Grizzled Skipper but a **Small Heath** was seen on the north pit. Also seen were Peacock, Green-veined White, Brimstone, Orange tip, Holly Blue and Speckled Wood - Liz Goodyear & Andrew Middleton

MUDCHUTE REPORT (April 07)- Having seen several Holly Blues in central Watford over the past weekend, I went over to Mudchute LNR today (April 18th) during my lunch-hour looking for them. I was fortunate and saw three Holly Blues. I also saw one tatty Small Tortoiseshell, a Comma, five

Speckled Woods, three Green-Veined Whites & twelve Small Whites. The total number species sightings I have made at the Mudchute site during this butterfly season is now 7 - Dave Chandler

Tuesday 17th April

Just spotted my first **Small Copper** of the year this lunchtime in a meadow in Grove Farm, **Greenford** (TQ18). Managed to get a picture too. Also saw 5 whites (1 of which disturbed the Copper and allowed me to spot it), 1 speckled Wood, and an Oak tree swarming with those Adelie moths (had a go at picturing them too will check them out later) during a very short walk - Mike Rubin

In the garden today: Brimstone, Peacock (3), Small White, Green-veined White, Orange Tip (2), Holly Blue (2), Speckled Wood - Robin Pearson

Monday 16th April

Another lunchtime walk in the fields west of **Horsenden Lane North**. $2 \times 1000 \, \text{My}$ first of 2007, once flying over a road and over a house), $11 \times 1000 \, \text{My}$ Peacock (including a couple of scraps, and what looked like a courtship dance.) $2 \times 1000 \, \text{My}$ Male Orange Tip (One of which was very small.) $7 \times 1000 \, \text{My}$ Speckled Wood (One was about half the size of all the others, which were normal size. Some were unusually pale.) Several unidentified whites. Plenty of bee flies and other hovering insects. Zillions of these small black insects with very long antennae. Swarming around Hawthorn and Oak in particular. What are they? - Mike Rubin

Waterford Heath - an early morning visit in the hope of locating a roosting Grizzled Skipper proved negative. However, did see a **Brown Argus** - Liz Goodyear

Sunday 15th April

Fir and Pond Wood NR - on the meadow, our first small copper of the year - David Gompertz

Saturday 14th April

Chorleywood Common - 6 Brimstone, 5 Peacock, 3 Orange Tip (2 male & one female nectaring on bluebell) Comma, Holly Blue, Large White, Several possible Small/Green Veined Whites & a suspected Small Tortoiseshell. Best of all four Long Horned Cattle, who attended the CMS Open Day as part of the public consultation on the restoration of grazing on the Common - Malcolm Hull 1 Holly Blue, **Totteridge** this afternoon - Tony Clancy

Ware garden, my first female Orange Tip - Liz Goodyear

Wednesday 11th April

After an almost butterfly-free weekend in Skegness, I return to find a male Orange Tip in front of the parish church in **Royston** this afternoon! Guy Manners

On **Tring Park Transect** today 11.04.07, saw my first Orange Tip. It was rather small, a male about the size of a Chalk Hill Blue! Also on my **Miswell Lane** transect I recorded 3 Speckled Woods - Brian Jessop

We had a male Orange Tip in our garden (**Enfield**) on **Saturday 7th April** (notice from web sight others had earlier records). Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock and Comma also. Had a possible Speckled Wood but it shot through fast so I'm not sure - Phil Rhodes

Despite 8/8 local overcast most of the time I saw 7 butterflies during a short lunchtime walk through **Grove Farm, TQ18.**, 1×5 Small White resting, and was able to get close for a positive ID. 2×5 Peacock both active / flying. 1×5 Comma also flying, 2×5 Speckled Wood both flying, 1×5 Unidentified White flying. Also spotted a moth that looked similar to Platyptilia Pallidactyla but not 100% as seen from a distance - Mike Rubin

Tuesday 10th April

Wandered around Paradise Fields to the **West of Horsenden Hill** (TQ18) today. Peacocks everywhere (lost count, easily well into double figures), frequently being disturbed even though 7/8's cumulus spreadout meant lots of cloud shadow. Saw also 2 Commas, 1 Male Brimstone, 1 Speckled Wood, 1 Small Tortoiseshell and an unidentified White (fairly small - I suspect either Small White or Orange Tip Female rather than GVW (definitely not Large White or Female

Brimstone) but not sure). Later in the walk cloud shadow got bad, and saw several Peacocks resting wings open. When I went near they slammed their wings shut as I approached. Some then flew off - Mike Rubin

Good numbers of butterflies visiting my **Stevenage** garden and **Great Ashby Park.** Lots of Peacocks and Brimstones (first female Sunday 8/4/07), Small Tortoiseshell, Small Whites and Red Admiral in smaller numbers. First Orange-tip today (10/4/07) on the park - Steve Lane

Sunday 8th April

In **Kenton** I saw a Comma fly in just before noon and bask in the garden then briefly settle on a heather plant before moving off again. First time I've seen a Comma in the garden this year, if ever (memory hazy about years prior to now). Two whites spotted fluttering past, one before I went out and one after I came back. Down Richmond way I buzzed a large dark butterfly (my bet is a Peacock) while riding the motorbike to see friends. For the first time this year I found bugs hitting my visor too, the bigger ones with quite a clunk at speed. I still haven't seen a moth since December 14th - Mike Rubin

Ware garden, first female Brimstone of the year for me - Liz Goodyear

Saturday 7th April

Here are some recent sightings. **Monday 2nd April,** my first Orange Tip of the year (a male) at **Shrubhill Common**, Hemel Hempstead. **Friday 6th April,** a pair of Speckled Woods performing courtship flight at **Shrubhill Common**, Hemel Hempstead. My first Speckled Woods of the year - Roger Prue

Yesterday in my neighbour's garden (Hampstead) an immaculate-looking Comma soaked up the rays - Mark Barclay

Friday 6th April

Just had my first **Orange tip** of the year, a male (Friday 6th April, 3.17, on the path between **Aldbury and the Bridgewater Monument at Ashridge**). This is my earliest ever Orange tip in 20 or so years of recording, the previous earliest being April 11th. I also saw my first Speckled wood of the season at Ashridge, but it was just over the border into Bedfordshire. Loads of Peacocks, Commas and Brimstones - Richard Harrington

Went to the **Rickmansworth Aquadrome** (TQ09) to lead an organised walk. I keeped my eyes peeled meanwhile. Round the north-west side of the lakes there were lots of Peacocks (especially round the north side of Stocker's Lake). More seen in the hills south of the lakes. Only one Comma, one male Brimstone and one unidentified white spotted. I agree with a previous poster that Peacock numbers are definitely up on last year and Commas down a bit. This week I have seen far fewer Commas than when they first came out. I wonder where they have gone? Then got back home and spotted a Speckled Wood flying around the garden in **Kenton** (TQ18) - Mike Rubin

Harpenden - 3 Peacocks, 1 Brimstone, 1 Comma today so far, then later **Orange Tip and Holly Blue** - Robin Pearson

Ware garden, my first male Orange Tip of the year - Liz Goodyear

Wednesday 4th April

Ware garden, **fresh green-veined white**, just released from closed greenhouse. Probably pupated in there plus several garlic mustard plants seeded inside last year as well! Liz Goodyear

Tuesday 3rd April

Sighting of small white on Monday on Rothamsted Estate, Harpenden - John Bater.

Monday 2nd April

A **Camberwell Beauty**. TQ1796. Fields north of **Elstree**. I only went there to see what the tetrad looked like - John Hollingdale

Hemel Hempstead, steady stream of Brimstones and two Peacocks in the garden but the best sighting was on the allotment in mid-afternoon when luckily I had my son David and his camera

with me. We walked to the wildlife garden and saw a Peacock, but shortly afterwards saw three Commas in close formation flying around at speed. One Comma broke away and disappeared while the remaining pair settled on a small tree close by and were soon "in cop" where David was able to take this photo. We were in the right place at the right time as I imagine that this is probably a once in a lifetime sighting - Malcolm Newland

Enjoying the late afternoon sunshine in **Maple Cross** - 7 peacocks and 3 small tortoiseshells - but no Camberwell Beauty as yet!! Ann Piper

Great Amwell, having our lunch in the garden today, we watched a pair of Brimstones doing their courtship for a good half hour. When they had decided on the right varigated ivy leaf, they got down to the serious business. We watched, discreetly of course, for the next hour then left them to it as we had to go shopping. I have just checked (6-30 pm) and the female is still there; I expect the male is having a doze somewhere, saving his strength for tomorrow! - Roy Stringer

Sunday 1st April

1 Brimstone, 2 peacocks and a Comma on **Hartham Common**, **Hertford**. 7 peacock, 4 Comma, ! Small White **Waterford Heath** South Pit and 2 peacocks and 1 Comma on the North Pit. In **Molewood**, 4 Peacocks, 1 Speckled Wood and a **1 male Orange Tip** - Andrew Wood

In warm, sunny weather and with the help of nine other volunteer wood wardens, I saw 5 Peacocks, 4 male Brimstones and one Comma in and around **Bencroft Wood** today (April 1st). This is not an April Fool! In just half an hour this morning on my usual walk around **Maple Cross** I saw my first small tortoiseshell of the year. In fact there were 4 all together. These are the first I have seen here since last July! So let's hope they are recovering from last year's poor showing! Also patrolling along the field margin were two whites - small or green veined. Had my first Brimstone of the year by the Emperors Head pub, Chells Manor **Stevenage** on **7/3/2007** - Darrel Bryant

Thursday 8th March - On a sunny afternoon I saw a Small Tortoiseshell and 3 Comma at **Ruislip Lido** - Steve Pash

Thursday 8th March

I went to a very muddy **Balls Wood** today and saw 1 Peacock and 2 Commas, but nothing at all on the way there or back from Ware - Andrew Wood

Two Red admirals at **Kew Gardens (Surrey)** this morning. Managed to get a picture, first of the year - Sezar Hikmet

Much Hadham, two Brimstones along Cox Lane and several other butterflies, too busy to stop and be identified! - Liz Goodyear

Wednesday 7th March

One Small Tortoiseshell sunning itself at lunchtime in Thorley Street - Tony Moverley

Tuesday 6th March

Hemel Hempstead, went into back garden at noon as it was sunny and warm for March to see a Red Admiral nectaring on Lonicera Fragrantissima. Looked in vain for the usual over wintering suspects. All very strange - Malcolm Newland

Delighted to say I saw my first garden butterfly today in **Hatfield**, a lovely shiny **Comma** on deep blue crocus in brilliant sunshine. (Also saw Bittern & Marsh Tit at Amwell, so things are looking up!) - John Moss

Red Admiral and Brimstone in **Ware Cemetery** and a Brimstone in Wengeo Lane today and a Red Admiral on Hartham Common, **Hertford** on **3 March** - Andrew Wood

A male Brimstone seen today flying across the high street in ${\bf Sawbridgeworth}$ at 13.25 - Simon Rasch

Ware, went outside at 12.45 and thought this is a Brimstone day, and within seconds, a Brimstone flew threw my front garden. 2 more seen, by Poles Lane in **Ware** being chased by a bird, and across the A120 at **Standon** - Liz Goodyear

Saturday 3rd March

Returning to house in **Tring** today, after some morning shopping, I saw a very bright butterfly fly over the road near my house while i was still about 200m away. Certainly seemed to be **Brimstone**, but at that distance could have been a Large White. On arrival at house I checked all around and cursed my luck at missing it, so busied myself emptying the car. While doing so i saw a shadow and looked up to see a male Brinstone fly across my garden and back the way it had come just moments earlier. This good fortune made me rush into back garden where my incautious haste scared up a Red Admiral which also rose and flew over the house. Neither were seen again, nor any other butterfly despite half an hour of searching likely local haunts - Nick Bowles

February 2007

Saturday 24th February

In the rain at lunchtime today, still clinging on in tonight's cold wind, parked up on our front window sill in sylvan(!) **Tower Hamlets**, a Brimstone in lovely nick. So far, so ho-hum. But a Brimstone moth rather than a Brimstone butterfly! That's a bit early, isn't it? Keir Mottram

Wednesday 21st February

On a warm spring-like day at **Amwell**, a Red Admiral - Alan Reynolds

Monday 19th February

1st butterfly of the year for me. A Red Admiral in the front garden **(Harrow)** this morning - John Hollingdale

Sunday 18th February

Just to let you know that out in wooded area near **Stocking's Wood,** off Codicote Road on Saturday saw a beautiful Peacock which posed wonderfully for photos - Terry Rodbard

Friday 16th February

I just thought it might be worth reporting a Red Admiral I saw yesterday, flying around a very urban street in **central London**; about 80-100m north of Euston Road. I've never seen one so early & so central before - Mike Taylor

Thursday 15th February

Red Admiral in flight across A10 at Church Lane traffic lights, Cheshunt - Liz Goodyear

Monday 12th February

1 'Early Moth' seen by Sauceywood nr Harpenden at 0100 today. Never seen a winter moth before - Darin Stanley

A lady visiting the sales stall yesterday reported finding a Small White adult which had hatched out in her glass conservatory in St Albans last week. Another visitor had seen a Red Admiral on Sunday morning - news via Malcolm Hull and Liz Goodyear

Friday 9th February

On Saturday **3rd February**, a Red Admiral was nectaring on a Veronica shrub ('Hebe') by the canal towpath (lock No 54) off Ravens Lane at **Berkhamsted** in the late morning; in the afternoon of **Thursday 1st February**, another flew through my garden at **Garston** (Watford); and one flew NW opposite **Watford High Street station** at 1315 hours on **Thursday 25th January**. **Media reports:** BBC News 24 on 4th February featured a photograph taken of a Red Admiral "in London" on **Wednesday 31st January**; at lunchtime on **Monday 29th January**, BBC weather presenter Peter Cockcroft reported that "a butterfly" had just flown past him on the roof of the London Weather Centre in **Holborn WC2** (TQ 30 81); and, finally, in mid-January BBC News also carried a photograph of a Red Admiral from **Uxbridge** - Colin Everett

Potters Bar - My wife drew my attention to a Red Admiral, which was resting on her washing on **1st Feb - Reg Brittain**

Wednesday 7th February

Saw my first moth at **Stanmore Country Park** today at 1pm; a Spring Usher. This is one day earlier than last year and that was a day-flier too - John Hollingdale

Tuesday 6th February

News from 1st Feb, **Ferny Hill, north Enfield** – peacock seen by Robin White – news via Robert Callf

Monday 5th February

It was a warm & sunny afternoon as I made my way to the match in **Watford** on **Saturday February 3rd** when, at 2pm. I saw my first butterfly of the year, a **Comma,** nectaring on a winter flowering shrub at Reeds Chapel, Central Park [nr. Wfd. Jct. Sta.]. It was the highlight of my day because the football was a real disappointment. Bring on the summer! David Chandler

Saturday 3rd February

Hemel Hempstead, Saturday at 11.30 a.m. sunny but cool, Red Admiral in good condition appeared in the garden settling on Buddleia Auriculata which has been flowering since last November. This sighting is my first ever of an "over wintering" Red Admiral and replaces my previous early record for this species which was on the 4th May 1987 - Malcolm Newland

At last I have joined the hallowed band. A definite Red Admiral today looking red (i.e. not orange) and black though distinctly less contrasty than usual. I presume it was long in the tooth. This individual in same area as the one I saw egg laying in December, my back of garden footie pitch in **Tring**. This individual was first alternating wing open basking with wing closed resting and then flew down from the vertical surface of a wooden fence to flutter about and 'taste' the tips of the extensive patch of white dead nettle at the fence base. I thought that there were no nettles about and wished the butterfly would explore an area about 10m to the west with several nettles

growing in a very sheltered position. I was convinced that this butterfly was looking to lay eggs, but although the butterfly found a single tip of stinging nettle that I hadn't spotted and perched on it for longer than any dead-nettle, as far as I could see no eggs were laid and the butterfly then flew up over the fence and was lost from sight into gardens with high walls. I waited a few minutes but it did not reappear. A little later about 300m away another dark butterfly flew rapidly and strongly past me about 8-9m up, through a small copse and it was heading due north. Was it deliberately moving north or was it simply that I saw it during a northward movement around its local patch? Nick Bowles

Watched a Red Admiral enjoying the afternoon sunshine in open country at the junction of Ambrose Lane and Cooters End Lane, **NW Harpenden** - Alan Jackson

Two Red Admirals this morning at **Amwell Nature Reserve** while I was watching the Little Bunting - Robin Pearson andWhilst waiting at **Amwell GPs** for the Little Bunting to show this morning the crowd was entertained by a Red Admiral enjoying the sunshine - Steve Lane

On Thursday I was waiting for the bus opposite the Sow and Pigs pub (**Thundridge**) and a lorry went past I thought a leaf had come out of the gutter and it went quite high in the air them back down again, them it went up and down the building for a good five minutes it was a lovely butterfly. It was orange and a brownish colour as it flew (was the other side of the road so not close views) size maybe a bit smaller than a peacock - Angela Sampford

Thursday 1st February

Today 11.30am at the lake along Hollycross Road between **Ware and Stanstead Abbotts**, I saw a **Brimstone** it flew across the lake then along the old lea and flew around the footbridge for awhile - Ian Edwards

Ware garden, a Red Admiral watched me prune the buddlieas today, flying around and then back to recharge on the pebble-dashed house front in the sun - Liz Goodyear

January 2007

Monday 29th January

One Red Admiral today on the wing in my rear garden in **Bishop's Stortford** around noon - Tony Moverley

Wednesday 24th January

On **20 January 2007**, I found a live specimen of the **speckled wood**. It was among a pile of dead leaves that I was clearing from my back yard, in **Tring**, Hertfordshire. The yard is surrounded by a ten foot high wall, is cobbled, and has no flowerbeds or grass within it. It is protected from all but severe winds, and the maximum temperature in the yard at ground level on that bright, sunny day was 11°C. Two days earlier (18 January) was a day of great gales and torrential rain, so the butterfly could have been blown into the yard, but its survival is remarkable considering the cold and wet conditions in the exposed piles of leaves. The nearest mixed grassland and woodland is only about 400 metres away, however, in the direction of the source of the prevailing wind. It appeared clean, fresh and undamaged, as if newly emerged from its chrysalis. It had enough strength to cling to my fingers, and when I placed it on some flowers in my greenhouse, it stayed put until it feebly flapped its wings, throwing itself to the ground. Despite several attempts to settle it on flowers, it repeatedly did this. So although not "on the wing", it was amazingly lively considering the conditions. This morning **(21 January)**, I can't find it, but it must still be in the greenhouse, although probably now dead - Ray Williams

Had another Red Admiral at home last Friday (19th) in **New Southgate**. That's two separate records for home so far this year... - Tom Clarke

Tuesday 23rd January

Just received a record from a **Sarratt** Parish Councillor that he had a Red Admiral roosting on a wall in his garden on **Saturday 20th Jan** - news via Jez Perkins

Saturday 20th January

Just to let you know I had a Red Admiral on the wing in my **Bishop's Stortford** garden, yesterday (19th Jan 2007) - Chris Dee

Yesterday (19th January 2007), during my lunch hour, I saw a Red Admiral flying in a street just south of **Kensington Gardens**. I was within 1/2 metre of it and it looked in good condition - Michael Robinson

Friday 19th January

Had a trip to **Rye House RSPB reserve** today and was surprised to see 2 **Peacocks**, flying in the early afternoon sun, my first ever sighting of butterflies in January - Steve Lane

Monday 15th January

A Red Admiral fluttering around the outside of a house in Watton Road, **Ware** this lunchtime - Andrew Wood

Red Admiral today at Walkern Road, **Stevenage**. Seen at 11.45 basking in sun on a wooden pallet after gliding around for a few minutes - Martin Shepherd

2 red admirals on **Tuesday 9th January** at **Camley Street Natural Park**, Kings Cross (NW1 0PW). 1 Red Admiral yesterday **Sunday 14th January** at Oak Hill Park in **East Barnet**. 1 Red Admiral yesterday in my garden, **New Southgate**. It's almost not worth sending them in now, so common!!!! Tom Clarke

Sunday 14th January

About 1pm today, in a sunny and sheltered glade at **Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park, two Red Admirals** circling each other in flight which took them out of the glade. Within a couple of minutes, one returned and gave excellent views perched on low-growing vegetation for 10+ minutes, basking, and was still there when we left the area. This insect was in pristine condition. The red bands on its forewings looked quite pale, orange-ish. Does anyone know if the intensity of colour in this band ranges widely and, if so, what determines it? - Keir Mottram (anyone know???? LG)

I was volunteering with the Wood Wardens in Hoddesdonpark Wood today: we were removing felled oaks from the archaeologically-important moated area on the southern edge of the wood (the oaks had been felled some time ago and a few had become quite rotten). At about midday I noticed a micro moth (Tortrix sp.?) on the ground. As I pointed it out to my colleagues an enormous female hornet dramatically appeared from nowhere. I observed it from a distance of about three feet. We all had excellent views of it before it flew off. A good sighting for Hertfordshire at any time of year, but a real treat for mid-January! OK, you're right, it's not a butterfly.... Alan Jackson

At 10.45 today a **Red Admiral** flew across our front garden in **Bengeo** and settled in a sunny spot on a neighbour's wall - Andrew Wood

Monday 1st January
