- * Safety tips are provided in our events list.

Members' Day & AGM


This is our main event of the year, with guest speakers, a photographic competition and lots more. A great opportunity to meet fellow members with a shared interest.

- * All sightings are kept on a Branch database and contribute to the Annual Report
- * Our records are shared with environmental records centres in Hertfordshire and in London, and of course with Butterfly Conservation's national database.
- * You can join more formal recording schemes, e.g. the Wider Countryside
 Butterfly Scheme or Transect recording contact our Records Collator for more information (contact details in the newsletter)
